



Safer driving on Indian Ocean Drive

AGRICULTURAL Region MLC Brian Ellis welcomed the recent announcement that nearly \$3 million has been provided to build vehicle overtaking lanes just north of the Yanhep Beach turn-off on Indian Ocean Drive.

Mr Ellis said the Barnett government was wasting no time and works had already started.

They are due to be completed by April next year.

“Within two years of being elected, the Barnett government fully funded the

\$95 million Lancelin-Cervantes road and delivered it under-budget, nine months ahead of schedule and just in time for the school holidays,” Mr Ellis said.

“This latest funding will make the coastal driving experience even safer for the thousands of holiday makers, caravaners and regional families.”

The project includes construction of a northbound and southbound passing lane; pavement widening; rehabilitation to a nearby parking bay; and modifica-

tions to intersections at Osman and Bindiar roads.

Densford Civil Pty Ltd has been awarded the \$2.63 million contract.

“Indian Ocean Drive was only opened in September and this new funding shows the commitment of the Barnett government to making it a premier tourist road which will benefit all the communities along the way,” Mr Ellis said.
