



## Have a say on state's biggest regional land survey

PEOPLE are invited to have their say in WA's biggest regional land survey.

The Regional Land Survey, which will be conducted by LandCorp this month, will measure annual demand for industrial land in regional WA.

The survey results will go beyond providing information for planning agencies and local governments to determine market demand for industrial land in the regions.

They will help with the ongoing development of industry attraction programs to enhance regional economies, business investment and employment growth.

The information will also help developers, landowners, tenants, businesses and industry to undertake informed pre-

liminary planning and develop business cases.

Agricultural Region MLC Brian Ellis, who has welcomed the survey, said industrial estates played an important role in supporting regional economic development.

"As a former deputy shire president for Moora, I am well aware of the complexities involved in establishing industrial estates," Mr Ellis aid.

"This was a frustration raised by many shires when I contacted them regarding local issues prior to the last election.

"The survey will help improve co-ordination, planning and delivery of light, general, heavy or special industrial land and I encourage participation."

It includes questions specific to each

of the state's nine regions and will provide an avenue for respondents to focus on their area of interest, while simultaneously collating data with state-wide implications.

LandCorp is working with regional development commissions, local governments, regional chambers of commerce and industry and the departments of Planning; State Development; and Regional Development and Lands to ensure industrial land is being developed to meet market needs and ensure a strategic approach to land supply.

The online survey has opened and closes at 5pm on Friday, December 3.
